## Reading



## This term

Maths: To start the year in Mathematics we will be focusing on our knowledge of number and place value. We will then use the skills learnt to continue to extend our understandings of the four operations, using reasoning, fluency and problem-solving questions to consolidate and deepen our learning.

Literacy: This term we will be studying a text called 'George's Secret Key to the Universe' written by Lucy and Stephen Hawking. We will use the text to complete a range of different writing forms and introduce some new ones to the children. We will be concentrating on a range of grammatical features during this term including noun phrases, modal verbs and a range of different punctuation used to separate clauses. The class will use the same text across the term, as well as various other texts on a range of contexts to deepen their understanding of reading skills.

Science: Our Science topic this term is Growing up and growing old. In this topic, children look at and describe the changes as humans develop to old age. Pupils draw a timeline to indicate stages in the growth and development of humans and learn about the changes experienced in puberty.

Geography: Our geography topic this half term is based on learning about earthquakes and volcanoes; how they are caused and the impact they have on people and places.

Religion: To begin with, in Religion we will be studying Christianity, focusing on what miracles can teach us about Jesus.

Art: We will be creating sculptures and a 3D interactive installation.

Computing: We will be learning about the importance of keeping safe online and coding using Purple Mash.

**PE**: This term we will be focusing on invaders games such as tag rugby, netball and basketball. We are also going to explore and learn about Tapuwae, a Maori game from New Zealand.

MFL: This term we will be learning the essential Spanish sound patterns/phonemes and vocabulary about pets!

PSHE: To begin with we will be exploring the shared characteristics of healthy family life, including commitment, care, spending time together; being there for each other in times of difficulty and ways in which the internet and social media can be used both positively and negatively.
