Reading



Keeping up with reading at a high level is a sure way of developing literacy skills and expanding vocabulary knowledge. The focus on daily reading will continue throughout the year.

Miss Mets

This term

Maths: To start the term in Mathematics we will be looking at division while exploring remainders. We will then move onto fractions to learn how to multiply fractions and find fractions of an amount. This will lead us into decimals and percentages and their relationships with fractions.

Literacy: This term in Literacy we will be reading the book Holes by Louis Sachar. The class will explore the main ideas and concepts of the texts before completing a range of forms that relate directly to it including; diary entries, an information text and a persuasive letter. Whilst studying this text and completing the different forms, the children will focus on their use of synonyms and antonyms, their use of adverbials and using parenthesis.

Science: Our Science topic this term is 'Circle of life'. In this topic children look at life cycles of various species - including mammals, amphibians and birds. They also look at and describe the life process of reproduction in plants and animals.

Humanities: This half term we will describe and understand key aspects of human geography, including: types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including minerals.

We will also locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe, North and South America, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, and countries.

Religion: Our topic this term is What happens in churches during Lent, Holy Week and Easter Sunday?'. The class will learn how the rituals of the church during Lent and Holy week represent the different parts of Jesus' journey.

DT: We will be exploring mechanical systems to create a functional four-page popup storybook design, using lever, sliders, layers and spacers to create paper-based mechanisms.

Computing: We will be learning how to design, create and evaluate a computer game.

PE: This term we will be learning how to perform and choreograph movements in time with music.

MFL: This term we will be learning about the Romans in Spanish. Through the medium of this familiar period of history, pupils will be taught the skills to understand slightly longer and more complicated text. Pupils will learn to 'gist' read, listen and understand more by using cognates and more familiar language to decode unknown language.

PSHE: We will be exploring mental health, what it is, and factors that can help and hinder it. We will also be looking at responding to intense or conflicting feelings.

Music: This term our class will continue to develop their abilities to perform rhythmic patterns with a strong sense of pulse. We will also be learning to read a range of rhythmic phrases.
