# CHARGING AND REMISSIONS POLICY

### Introduction

This document is a statement of the aims, principles and strategies for charging and remissions at St Gabriel's C of E Primary School.

#### A. Aims

## Our aims in developing this policy are:

- To ensure that as many children as possible are able to access all the provision on offer.
- · To ensure transparency in setting charges and making remissions.

## **B. Principles of Charging and Remissions**

We believe as many children as possible should have equal opportunities to benefit fully from school activities, both on and off site, within and beyond the curriculum, regardless of their family's financial means.

We understand that pupils whose parents receive one of the support payments below are legally entitled to remissions where specified in law:

- Income support IS)
- Income based jobseekers allowance (IBJSA)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child tax credit or working tax credit
- The guarantee element of state pension credit
- An income related employment and support allowance that has replaced incapacity benefit
