

P.E

We have P.E lessons on Monday and Thursday. Please make sure that your child comes to school in their correct school uniform (including school shoes please) and brings the correct PE kit on these days. Their kit should be in a bag with every item of clothing labelled. If your child is unable to participate in a P.E lesson, please send a note giving reasons. Children should wear a black St Gabriel's fleece or plain black sweat shirt. In the colder weather children can wear plain black tracksuit bottoms, plain black joggy bottoms, or plain black running leggings. Children are not allowed to wear hoodies to school (this includes during PE lessons).

Reading

Maths: To start the year in Mathematics we will be consolidating our knowledge of place value and the four operations. We will be refining our written methods and identifying new ways of calculating equations with greater efficiency.

Literacy: This term in Literacy we will be re-writing our own versions of Charles Dickens 'Great Expectations'. In order to gain an understanding, we will be reading an abridged version of the classic text. This topic will allow us to gain confidence in grammatical features such as adverbials and connectives while also providing us with the opportunity to create more complex sentences by expanding the noun phrase.

Science: Our Science topic this term is 'Let it Shine' where we will investigate the properties of light while attempting to separate the colours of white light and observing the light spectrum. We will also investigate silhouettes and their properties.

Religion: To begin with in Religion we will be studying Christianity, looking at what the journey of life and death might look like from a Christian perspective.

History: Our topic for this term is about how WWI affected Britain. In History, children will compare local, British and world history and understand how our knowledge of the past is linked to sources. We will also have the opportunity to work with Westminster Archives centre and go on many trips.

Art: In Art this half term the children will be studying photography.

Computing: To start the year we will be focusing on Online Safety and then developing the children's coding skills.

PSHE: In PSHE our focus is on recognising feelings and considering different ways that we can cope with emotions.

MfL: In Spanish this half term the children will be developing their knowledge of the alphabet and then learning about school items.

PE: In PE the children will be continuing with Tapuwae and also considering the impact of physical movement on their bodies during circuit based activities.

Music: The children will improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the inter-related dimensions of music.
