

P.E

We have P.E lessons on **Wednesday and Friday**.

Please make sure that your child wears the correct PE kit on these days. If your child is unable to participate in a P.E lesson, please send a note giving reasons. Children should wear a black St Gabriel's fleece or plain black sweat shirt. In the colder weather children can wear plain black tracksuit bottoms, plain black joggy bottoms, or plain black running leggings. Children are not allowed to wear hoodies to school (this includes during PE lessons).

Reading

Children should choose a book from the class library to read at home every night. It is important that your child has the opportunity to read at home every day. When your child reads, please ensure they record their progress in their reading record as this will allow both teachers and parents to monitor your child's reading. These books should be brought into class every day to be checked by the teacher. Keeping up with reading at a high level is a sure way of ensuring a good start to secondary school. We will be maintaining our focus in this area.

Homework

For homework we will continue doing Genius Work - some of the work brought in was of an excellent standard, we must ensure that this continues, and everyone is fully involved. Children will also be set spellings and times tables. It is imperative that these are learned for a test at the end of the week. Please remember that it is essential to be reading every day. It really does make the world of difference! I will also set homework each Friday but be aware this is **not compulsory**.

Maths: In maths this term we will be revising the Year 6 maths curriculum in preparation for SATs. Initially, we will be focusing on area, perimeter and volume, geometry and statistics.

Literacy: There will continue to be a focus on writing in addition to the SATs and this half term we will be concentrating on formality of writing and the use and control of grammar and punctuation that demonstrates a controlled style and maturity of writing. The text we will use to support our work is called *The Savage*.

Science: Our Science topic for the term is *Staying Alive*. We will be learning all about human anatomy in this topic. We will study the different systems of the body and consider how we can stay healthy.

Religion: Religion this term will be focused on how the Christian message has spread in the last 2000 years.

Geography: We will be completing a fieldwork study in Geography this half term called *A Walk Through Westminster*.

Art: The children will be working with 3D sculptures on a unit called *Making Memories*.

PHSE: The children will learn about the risks and effects of legal drugs including cigarettes and alcohol and recognise laws surrounding drug use.

Music: In music, the children will be composing melodies and developing their understanding of the history of music.

Computing: We will be continuing with our work on quizzing in addition to understanding binary code.

PE: This half term the children be focusing on striking and fielding as well as working with *Lord's Cricket*.

Spanish: The children will use the context of *The Vikings* to practice reading, writing and speaking in Spanish.
