

P.E

We have P.E lessons on *Monday* and *Friday*. Pupils may now come to school in their PE kit on PE day. If your child is unable to participate in a PE lesson, please send a note giving reasons. Children should wear a black St Gabriel's fleece or plain black sweat shirt. In this colder weather children can wear plain black tracksuit bottoms, plain black joggy bottoms, or plain black running leggings. Children are not allowed to wear hoodies to school (this includes during PE lessons).

Reading

When your child reads, please ensure they record their progress and fill out their reading record as this will allow both teachers and parents to monitor your child's reading. Maths: Having established a solid knowledge and understanding of the four operations, calculation and properties of number we are going to continue our learning with fractions and measurement.

Literacy: This term in Literacy we will be concentrating on a number of genres and will be starting with another extended narrative this time based on Shakespeare's Macbeth.

We will also complete a balanced argument. We will strengthen our knowledge of grammar by focusing on formal language, layout devices and the use of the perfect form of verbs.

Science: Our Science topic this term is 'Electrifying!' The children will learn to develop their understanding of electrical components, giving reasons for variations in how components function.

Religion: Religion this term will be focused around Christmas. We will be looking at how Christmas is advertised both globally and locally. The children will be given the opportunity to discuss their own experiences with different cultures at Christmas time.

History: This term we will be continuing our study of Real London Lives and how World War 1 impacted Britain. As part of this, we will be visiting Westminster Abbey and learning about the Unknown Warrior.

Design Technology: This half term we will be creating prototypes of school playgrounds.

PHSE: Following statutory national curriculum objectives, we will be looking at different types of relationships, family structures and how some families can look different to our own. More information on our RSE and PSHE curriculum is available on the subjects page of our website.

Music: We will continue to work with PMF, focussing on the ability to perform rhythmic patterns confidently and with a strong sense of pulse.

Computing: We will be learning about the huge importance of online safety.

PE: The children will be focusing on netball skills (games that involve nets such as tennis and badminton) as well as taking part in 'Boxercise'.

Spanish: Children will continue to learn to pronounce school subjects as well as focusing on the use of regular verbs.
